I was walking home from the Shuk one Friday afternoon, humming to myself as I often do. The four lines “Ein Trop Vasser, Me’Lerent Abisel Veiter, Me’Arbet Oif Zich Veiter, Me’Gleibt Abisel Veiter”, just came into my head in song. When I shared it with family and friends, they, and especially my good friend Yanky Schwartz, encouraged me to complete the song. Sruli Lipschitz mentioned that the words “Ein Davar Haomed, Sheva Yipol Tzaddik Vekom”, might be suitable for this song. I often thought that the Pasuk, that a Tzaddik falls seven times, and gets up, can be interpreted that while one can fall without too much effort, rising or getting up is much tougher. The word Kom in Yiddish means barely, which ties in with the notion that getting up after a fall is sometimes barely manageable. Therefore, if we push a little harder, work a little more, we can triumph over everything. I found that “Sheva Yipol Tzaddik”, ties in so well with the composition.

Father of orphans and Defender of widows, Hashem in His holy dwelling. (Psalms 68:8) May Hashem, our God, be with us as He was with our forefathers, may He not forsake us nor cast us off. I Kings 8:57 You who cling to Hashem, your God, are all alive today. (Deuteronomy 4:4)

This gem came to me on a Motzie Shabbos, a short period after my father's A"H passing. I was in my apartment in the Beth Yisroel neighborhood, in Yerushalayim. I took out my guitar and I was reciting the weekly blessing of "Veyiten Lecha". The Nusach of that particular Siddur had the following Pesukim of "Avi Yesomim" included in the paragraph titled "Omar Reb Yochanan". The tune that came to me was one filled with longing, from a son to his father. The first phrase "Avi Yesomim" expresses the emotions of one missing their parent, but it also inspired me to the thought, that the Ribbono Shel Olam has taken on the role of my Father. This also got me thinking about the next phrase "Yehee Hashem Elokeini" which is a prayer to our Father, Hashem to be with us. The third and final phrase "Ve'atem" is the conclusion of the song as well as a response from Hashem to our prayers. As I once saw in a Siddur, this gives us encouragement in our lives and it is both an inspiration and a warning. An inspiring call to the privileged to be concerned with the weak as Hashem is, and a warning not to take advantage of the defenseless, for G-D is the Father of orphans. My friend Pinchas Deutsch, a great musician and songwriter, was there during the composition. Later on he kept asking me about it, and that's the reason this song is on the album.

The first song I ever recorded was composed in the Dirah I shared with my good friend Y.Y. Phill, in Yerushalayim, where we would jam often. It was a few days before Purim, and I thought it would be funny to write a serious song about the happiest holiday in the Jewish calendar. So I started singing Venahapoichu as a slow song. After composing the first part, I realized that it was pretty good, so I recorded it on my phone. As I was recording it, the next part seemed to write itself. My friend and guitar Chavrusa Shmuel Lam who was with me at the time, thought it was good as did my friend Chaim Adler, who suggested that I end it with "dim, dim, dim". When I sang it to my friends in Kollel, they loved it and began singing it. So once I had the opportunity to record it in a studio, I went for it, and the rest is history.

The way that a person judges others is the same way he is judged

I wrote this song while learning the words “Bemide Sheodom Moded” in Mishnay-
os “Mesechta Sota”. It means that the way a person judges another, is the way he
himself is judged. This also reminded me of what my father A”H shared with
me. The Baal Shem Tov asks a question about the expression

Din v’Cheshbon, (Judgment and calculation). Why
do we say Din before Cheshbon? Shouldn’t it be
written the other way around? The Baal Shem Tov
answers that the Neshamah will be judged
according to the way a person judges others.
When you are Dan, or judge another with
kindness, you will be judged and given Cheshbon
with kindness.

This song veers back and forth, looking at oneself from opposite
perspectives. It’s important for us to realize our own self-worth,
while at the same time striving to be better, for if we are
dishonest with ourselves, it is only ourselves we are fooling.
There is a Pasuk in Tehillim: “Im Esak Shomayim Shom Otoh”; if
I should ascend to Heaven, You are there with me; “Veatziah
Sheol Hinecka”; and if I should descend into Gehinnom You are
right here with me. If one thinks of oneself as a righteous man,
Hashem is actually far from him. However, if one thinks of
oneself as lowly and is humble, Hashem is actually there with
him. The Baal Shem Tov says that a Rasha who acknowledges he
is a Rasha, is better off than a person who believes he is a
Tzaddik. My friends Lazer and his wife Raizy Weiss together
with Yanky Schwartz helped me get clarification on this
thought, and complete the song.





This song is another one of the many examples of Hashgacha Pratis I experienced on my musical journey. One evening, I was fiddling around with the guitar, idly playing some chords. One riff led to another and before I knew it, I had another little tune. My friends Yanky Rosenberg and Nussy Levy thought it sounded good. There was a Sefer Tehillim nearby, so I quickly searched for lyrics to match the tune; I found it in the Pasuk in תהלים מב:ט. The next day on my way to Uman, I met my friend and jamming buddy Eli J. Sitting in a corner in the terminal, we played it, and it fit really well. The song continued on with us to Uman, where it was picked up by the Chevra. By the time I arrived to Israel, I was greeted by the sound of the song being sung widely. Shortly after that, we released the now famous video filmed in Shuk Machane Yehudah, which had been, and still is, a great source of inspiration for me.
