



Sheindi Miller-Arenvald's diary is a rare documentation of the story of a fifteen-year old Jewish girl from Galanta after her town was captured by the Germans. She took the pages of her diary with her on the train to Auschwitz and managed to preserve them under the most challenging, perilous circumstances, until she reached Jerusalem. When Sheindi translated her diary from Hungarian to Hebrew, she supplemented in her own memories that she bears and that accompany her throughout her life. The diary, the memories and the lessons serve as a testimony for her family, friends and to all the Jews of Galanta who withstood the most inhuman conditions with unparalleled strength, supported each other and prayed together until the final moments of the war.
