



Lesson plan-Flights

6th grade

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Hello girls, my name is Efrat and we're going to learn an English lesson together. I want you to write your names on the cards, I want to see your names.

First of all, let's look at the screen and watch the film. I want you to tell me where/when we can watch this film.

When a person flies to any country, he has to watch this film when he gets on the plane.

We're going to learn some important words about **flights**

Let's imagine that we're going to travel to another country.

To which country do you want to fly? (I hang up pictures of China, England and France).

First of all we have to buy **a ticket**.

In the suitcase you've got there are stickers, stick the sticker of the country you want to fly to.

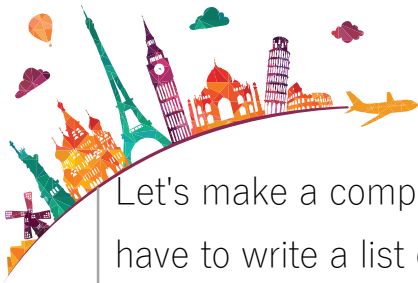
We also have to issue a **passport**. Who has a passport?

Let's fill in the details in the passport. Your name, your last name and so on.

After we have a passport and a ticket, what do we have to do?

To pack a suitcase. When we put things in the suitcase we say- we pack.

Let's **pack a suitcase**. What do we need to take on the trip?



Let's make a competition. Open your suitcase and take out the list. In pairs you have to write a list of things to pack in your suitcase. The pair who has the longest list is the winner. You have one minute.

How many items do you have on your list? Your suitcase is so heavy!

Time for singing

Time for playing Do you know the game tic-tac-toe? I want to divide you into two groups. Look at the barcode in the ticket. If the last number is 1-you belong to group one...who wants to come? Pick a picture and tell us to which it connected to. If you do it correctly, you can choose where to put your x/o. If not- the other group has the chance to answer.

Did you pack everything in your suitcase? Let's go to the airport.

Anyone who wants to fly, comes to the airport where the planes take off and land (I explain to the Ss by hand motions).

What does the word "**airport**" mean? Which airport do you know?

Who was in an airport?

Let's get on the **plane**. Here we are!

If you need any help you can call the **stewardess**. If you want food, a pillow, water- you call the stewardess. Repeat after me.

Time for playing: Chanukah is coming and I want to give you *Chanukah Gelet*

Each pair gets chocolate coins that have pictures of the new words. You have to choose a picture and then throw the coin- the one who chose this side gets the coin.



Anyone who goes on the plane- you and me, and everybody-we're the passengers.

The **passengers** get on the plane and sit down.

Time for singing

Now they have to **fasten the seat belt**. We don't hear the "t" in the verb fasten. Repeat after me- fasten the seat belt.

Time for listening: I want you to put your heads on the table and listen. (A recording): Dear passengers, welcome to the plane. Please sit down and fasten your seatbelt. If you need help- call the stewardess. Have a safe flight!

Stewardess! Stewardess! I need help!

How can I help you?

I can't fasten my seat belt.

Let me help you, do it like this.

Oh, thank you.

You're welcome.

In pairs, you have to put the sentences in the right order.

For example: what was the first sentence? "Stewardess! Stewardess!"

Turn the cards to the other side and if you get a plane it shows that you've done it correctly.

In pairs- one is the passenger and the other one is the stewardess, act it out.

Time for presentation: who wants to come and act it out? / One group is the stewardess and the other one is the passenger. Let's act it out together.



Time for playing: Each two girls get a plane with the same word in English. When I say the word in Hebrew they have to run and pick it from the board. The girl who comes first is the winner.

Now, that you know all the words so nicely, the plane can finally take off.

Time for singing

Time for creativity: prepare a poster wishing your friend who sit next to you a pleasant flight. You can write: Take my love in your suitcase/ If you need anything-ask the stewardess/ Have a safe flight! / enjoy! Etc.
